

ORDINANCE NO. 68-15

"AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF  
PORTAGE, INDIANA, CREATING A  
DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT."

WHEREAS, the "Municipal Economic Development Act of 1965" (Burns Indiana Statutes 48-8701 through 48-8725) authorizes municipalities to create and establish a department of economic development to combat the harmful conditions of insufficient diversification of industry,

and WHEREAS, it is hereby declared by the Common Council of the City of Portage, Indiana, that such harmful condition of insufficient diversification of industry exists in the City of Portage,

NOW THEREFORE, be it and it hereby is ordained by the Common Council of the City of Portage, Indiana, as follows:

1. That there is hereby created in the City of Portage, Indiana, a department of economic development, pursuant to authority as above cited, to be known as "The Portage Economic Development Commission" ;

2. That said department shall be governed by a board of three (3) members, to be appointed by the Mayor of the City of Portage, Indiana, as follows: one of the members so appointed shall be selected by the Mayor; one shall be selected by the County Council of the County of Porter, Indiana; and one shall be selected by the Common Council of the City of Portage, Indiana. The commissioners so appointed shall take office upon their appointment and their terms shall run the following number of years from February 1, 1969: the commissioner selected by the Common Council-- two (2) years; the commissioner selected by the County Council-- one (1) year; the commissioner selected by the

WHEREAS, the Chicago Police Department has been authorized by the Illinois State Board of Police to establish a Police Academy for the purpose of training and educating police officers in the State of Illinois; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Council of the City of Chicago, as follows:

1. That there is hereby enacted in the City of Chicago, Illinois, a Police Academy to be known as the Chicago Police Academy, to be located at the intersection of [redacted] and [redacted] streets, in the [redacted] ward of the City of Chicago, Illinois.
2. That the Board of Police shall have the honor and authority to select and appoint to the position of [redacted] of the Chicago Police Academy, a person who shall be qualified to perform the duties of such position.

shall fail to qualify as hereinafter provided within ten (10) days after the mailing to him of notice of his appointment, or if any member after qualifying shall die, resign or vacate such office, or be removed as hereinafter provided, a new member shall be chosen and appointed to fill such vacancy in the same manner as provided for the member in respect to whom such vacancy occurred, and the member so chosen and appointed shall serve for the remainder of the vacated term. Such commissioners shall receive no salaries but shall be entitled to reimbursement for any expenses necessarily incurred in the performance of their duty.

3. No person shall be appointed as a commissioner who is not either a resident of the City of Portage, employed in such city, or owner of a business in such city. If any commissioner shall cease to qualify in one of the above categories, his appointment on such board shall thereby terminate and his office shall become vacant. Each commissioner, before entering upon his duties, shall take and subscribe an oath of office in the usual form, to be endorsed upon the certificate of his appointment, which shall be promptly filed with the clerk. The commission originally appointed shall meet within thirty (30) days after its appointment at a time and place designated by the Mayor of the City of Portage for the purpose of organization, and shall meet to reorganize in the month of February of the succeeding year. The commission shall elect one of its members as president, one as vice-president, and one as secretary, each of which officers shall serve from the day of his election until the thirty-first day of January next following his election and until his successor is elected and qualified.

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3. No person shall be appointed as a commissioner who is not either a resident of the City of Portage, employed in such city, or owner of a business in such city. If any commissioner shall cease to qualify in one of the above categories, his appointment on such board shall thereby terminate and his office shall become vacant. 5. Said commission shall have all powers, privileges, and duties as provided by the "Municipal Economic Development Act of 1965" and as granted by all acts of the Indiana General Assembly heretofore or hereafter enacted.

6. That all ordinances or parts thereof of the City of Portage in conflict hereof are hereby repealed and declared null and void.
